PEDESTRIANS

It is compulsory to stop and give way to pedestrians already on marked crossings.

A driver must give way - and therefore slow down and if necessary stop - to any pedestrian who is either going to cross at zebra crossings or already crossing a road with no pedestrian crossing available.

Special attention must be paid to disabled persons, elderly people and children crossing the road. The behaviour of these vulnerable road users must be reasonably anticipated by the driver.

FINE for non-compliance (article 191, paragraph 4, Italian Highway Code): 162 to 646 Euros. PENALTY POINTS on driving licence for not giving way to a pedestrian crossing a road with no pedestrian crossing available, enabling him/her to safely reach the opposite side of the road: -4 out of 20 full starting points.

PENALTY POINTS on driving licence for not giving way to a pedestrian crossing at a zebra or failing to stop when disabled persons, elderly people and children are crossing the road: -8 out of 20 full starting points.
